Greetings Members....

As we all prepare for these family events we hope you are taking the time to enjoy the Fall and schedule a color tour in your Corvette.

Since many of our members live away from Little Rock and it is inconvenient to attend regular monthly meetings, I have tried to keep you abreast of club information and the up-coming elections of Officers and Board Members. As you will read in the minutes of our last meeting, I presented a proposal to members that we elect Board Members not 'at-large' but as part of 3 categories so that we have continuity from year to year. Instead of tossing new Board members into a position vacated by a previous member, they would be elected to assist a current Board Member in one of the categories and then they would lead that category in the subsequent year with a new elected assistant. Taking into consideration some categories proposed in 2011 and some functions already defined in our by-laws, ı proposed the

categories of Membership Services, Club Events, and Public Relations

Under Membership Services, there would be new member packages, name tags, chaplain (appointed), apparel (Ad-Graphics), membership lists, and recognition awards.

The 2nd category, Club Events, would include Hot Springs show, other major events such as our Cabot show & co-hosting Eureka Springs, calendar of events, socials, parties, and parades.

The 3rd category, Public Relations, would include charities (fundraising), public announcements (papers, directories, TV, radio, Facebook), club signage, webmaster (appointed), newsletter editor (appointed).

By a unanimous show-of-hands, the members agreed with this proposal and once official language is adopted for the bylaws it can be put in effect or put to the membership for a final vote. Chairpersons and volunteers currently perform many of these tasks and we hope that they will continue to do so. Each of these chairpersons or volunteers will report to the pair of Board Members who will keep the

officers of the club apprised of details and any areas needing assistance and coordination.

You have received several emails regarding the upcoming elections and the club is looking for new officers and Board Members for these categories to lead us forward. Please nominate individuals that will compliment the responsibilities and duties of the respective positions.

It has been an honor to have had the opportunity to serve the club as President for 2014 and despite being encouraged to run for a second term I've decided that I will withdraw and devote my time to several other endeavors.
